

Typical Human Clutter from an Average Size Family Unit

Heaps and small clusters of objects and waste formed by everyday life in an average size Human Family Unit consisting of two full grown Humans (so called Adults) and two not fully grown Humans (so called Children) living in a space called an Apartment in the outskirts of a City that is named the Capitol of an area that is called a Nation which is part of a Union on a northern continent of the planet Earth.

Documentation of:

Plaything (called a Toy) for small Children (the not fully grown Humans) looking good on top of a piece of furniture containing sewing tools and yarn from an older Human called a Grand Mother.

Sewing tools from the older Human called a Grand Mother.

Miniature landscape in plastic box made from sand, sticks, leaves and plastic figures by one not fully grown Human, called a Child.

So-called Indian Pearls which aren't Pearls (shiny spheres) but pieces of plastic and not Indian (from a nation on the Asian Continent) but resembling beads made by native American (another Continent that was mixed up with the Nation India when "discovered" by Humans from the European continent) people.

Chair from a global furniture Company (big economic entity) with playthings, also called Toys, on it.

Paintings made by Children.

A porcelain rabbit visiting someone living in a plastic house.

Hot zone in kitchen under microwave oven where all important things gather, such as pocket camera, egg clock, earmuffs for construction workers, newspaper, cords, fruit, cough drops, old non-working scales.

Not fresh flowers.

A House (contained living space) made for playthings looking like small humans, called Dolls.

Washed up glasses and Cups (containers for drinking fluid) in a dish drainer (a construction to keep containers while drying from being cleaned).

Pigment in different colors that when mixed with water become paint (see "Paintings made by Children" for example of use).

Playthings (also called Toys) made from plastic pieces that can fit together in different constructions (called LEGO™) here in shapes of Superheroes and Supervillains, which is persons with supernatural powers who are either good or bad.

A one-person-vehicle called a Bicycle in size for a not fully grown Human (a Child).

Gift wrapping paper made by Children (not fully grown Humans) to be wrapped around a Gift (something one gives away) at Christmas, which is a Holiday (a Day of Celebration of Gods, or Men in Beards with Reindeer).

A Chair (piece of Furniture to sit on) with Books (collection of Text such as this about all kinds of things) beside Bed where most Humans spend several hours every Night (when the sun is not up) in shut down mode which is called Sleeping.

Magazines and some Books for Children with Text and Images in a pile with Broken (no longer functioning) paper Lamp (device for light) on top.

Children's Books and Puzzles (images in pieces made from wood or cardboard).

Piles of Children's Puzzles (see above) and Board Games (simulation of strategic actions through images and text and pieces of plastic for Entertainment or Fun).

Suitcase filled with Garments (textile to wear) for Dressing up (a sort of play with characters).

Pile of different Things (uncategorized objects).

A Bead Pegboard (a pegged board in various shapes to make images out of beads) with so called Indian Pearls put in a circle.

Newspaper (paper with text and images presenting News, which is things that has just happened that Humans think are important), Play Dough (a soft molding material to play with called Clay), Egg Cup (Cup for Eggs), a Bowl of home grown Tomatoes and other Stuff (uncategorized objects).

Computer (writing and computing machine) with Screen showing a Serious Error (as in Deadly when a machine is about to terminate) in Graphics Board sitting on Bed (see above).

A small Chair for Children with Things and Stuff on and around.
